



THE CAMBRIDGE TUBEROUS SCLEROSIS CLINIC

Under the direction of Dr Ayla Humphrey (Consultant Clinical Psychologist), Dr Alasdair Parker (Consultant Paediatric Neurologist) and Dr Lucy Raymond (Senior Lecturer and Honorary Consultant in Medical Genetics), the Cambridge Tuberos Sclerosis Clinic specialises in the complex behavioural and developmental problems that accompany Tuberos Sclerosis, as well as the genetic and neurological aspects of the condition. It offers advice in establishing the diagnosis, problem behaviour, genetic investigation, issues of development and management of epilepsy.

The Cambridge Infant Clinic was set up to provide parents with answers to questions about their young children's development and prognosis. It offers families with pre-school children advice on fostering their child's development, providing ongoing support to parents with a view towards helping families encourage their child's development and manage behavioural difficulties as they arise.
